### **BUGA**

Ride a Buga (Aveiro's fee free utilization bicycle). You can find cycling tracks inside the university campus and all over town.

### **Excursion in Moliceiro**

Excursion in the traditional boat *Moliceiro* throughout *Ria* into *salinas* (salt works: portion of land/water where salt is produced).

### **Ecomuseu da Troncalhada**

Opening hours: open sky museum

Free admission

Short description: An open sky museum devoted to salt and its production. Here you can see how salt is taken from the salty water of Ria.

### **Tour on Azulejos**

You can find *azulejos* (glazed tiles) all over the city. But some points are mandatory to visit

### **Museu de Aveiro**

Address: Av. de Santa Joana Princesa - Aveiro

Opening hours: Tuesday to Sunday 10h00-13h00 and 14h00-18h00; Closed on Monday

Entrance fee: 2 Euro

Free admission: Sundays and bank holidays, until 14h

Discounts (upon presentation of relevant card): Young people aged 15-25; Teachers; 60% - Youth Card holders

Transport Buses: lines 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 12

Short description: Founded in 1911, the *Museu de Aveiro* occupies the build-

ing of the former Convent of Jesus, preserving intact some spaces of earlier convent life that are included in the visit route of the museum. The collection of the museum comes from the Convent of Jesus and from different religious buildings located within the city and throughout the country. This transfer of objects was due to the liberal legislation of the 19th century that abolished the religious orders and confiscated the respective property in the name of the State. ### **Museu Marítimo de Ílhavo**

Opening hours: Tuesday to Friday 10h00-12h30 and 14h-17h30; Weekend 14h-17h30; Closed on Monday

Short description: Founded in 1937 this museum is devoted to *faina maior* and life in *Ria de Aveiro*. *Faina maior* is the name given to the old way of fishing cod-fish in the North Sea (a single man in a small boat called *dóris*). In 2001 *Museu Marítimo de Ílhavo* re-opened in a new building which is already a reference in architecture (see *The Architectural Review*, July 2004).
